# India: diverse culture, diverse needs

The flower lei was still heavy with water when the India Evangelical Lutheran Church (IELC) officers garlanded their visitors—Dan's introduction to a gracious custom of welcoming guests of honor.

## **OUR PURPOSE**

This past November Dan joined the Asia Regional Director Pastor Ferry, and Mr. Storkson from Church Relations, to learn more about the diverse challenges the IELC faces, understand the context, and also to witness the great progress the seminary has made with LCMS disaster relief funds for recovery efforts after the seminary was severely damaged by Cyclone Ockhi in November of 2017.

## **IN THE BEGINNING**

A little background for you, our readers. The LC–MS began their very first missionary efforts in this most religiously diverse country of the world back in 1894. The India Evangelical Lutheran Church (IELC) grew out of these efforts, which now has nearly 800 congregations, over 100 of its own national pastors, a seminary, schools and hospitals; eventually they became our partner church in 1959.

## **MOVING AHEAD**

The work looks very different now than it did a hundred years ago or even since this past decade. "We need new efforts as we help our partner church face a new set of challenges compared to the first generation context," Dan notes.
