From the Pastor's Desk

Dear friends in Christ,

Halloween is kind of a silly tradition, isn't it? Kids (and sometimes adults, too) dress up in goofy costumes and pretend to be something they are not, as an excuse to gather a large stockpile of candy (the dentists must be thrilled) or to attend a party. I remember trick-or-treating when I was younger. I'd get so excited about it. "What am I going to be this year," I'd ponder in the month before that sugar-filled evening. I am even a "trick-or-treat" survivor of the 1991 Halloween blizzard.

Halloween is not the only time we put on costumes and pretend to be something we're not, though. We all would like to present ourselves to this world as folks who have their act together, as people who do the right thing, as just and righteous folks. We even think of ourselves quite often as just and righteous folks. Just like a little child might refuse to budge from the claim "I'm Batman" on Halloween, we refuse to acknowledge the reality of our sin. We try to clothe ourselves as a righteous person, every day, because to acknowledge the reality is to acknowledge that we fall short. In 1 John 1:8, John writes, "If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us." No matter the costume we try to put on ourselves, we cannot cover over the reality of our sin. Isaiah 1:18 says our sins "are like scarlet." These sins we try to cover over with a façade, or costume, of righteousness stick out. Even if we can fool one another, and even fool ourselves, we cannot fool our Lord. St. Paul writes in Romans 3:10, "None is righteous, no, not one."

For all the play acting we do, trying to present our sinful selves righteous, you'd think perhaps we were just ignorant of the reality. But God's Law is written on our hearts (Romans 2:15), and on some level we are all aware that we have fallen short. Indeed, because of the fact that the situation is so dire, sin begets more sin, as people cease to struggle against the temptations of the devil, the world, and our own sinful nature.

But even in the midst of this sinful state, there is good news for us. "While we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8). Christ frees us from our slavery to sin by granting us forgiveness, pardon, and peace. He makes our sins to be "white as snow" (Isaiah I:18). 1 John 1:9 continues, "If we confess our sins, God is faithful and just to forgive our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness." There is forgiveness for us, worked by our God.

He even gives to us a new "costume" to wear. But, in contrast to a superhero costume on Halloween, or even in contrast to our own attempts to cover ourselves in righteousness, the new "costume" we are given by our Lord actually affects a change in us. He does this in Holy Baptism. Galatians 3:27 says, "As many of you as were baptized into Christ have put on Christ." We have been clothed with Christ. When our Heavenly Father looks upon us, rather than seeing in us our sinful state, He promises to look upon us and see the righteousness of His Son. Moreover, He actually gives to us this righteousness. While we still sin, and still need to struggle daily against sin, we at the same time already have been granted the victory through the work of our Lord Jesus, received by faithfully trusting in Him alone for forgiveness, life, and salvation. This "new you" is something you'd never want to cover over!
