From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

November is a month that, in my life, has been characterized by one thing: turkeys! Every year the family would gather together, cook up a turkey (in some years, my brothers became deep frying aficionados, and then there were two turkeys), and share a delightful meal together, one that left everyone overstuffed. Likewise, in my late teens and early college years, as I worked in a grocery store, it seemed every other person was coming in to buy a turkey. Turkeys have been a big part of November.

I also had a good friend growing up whose father liked to call us a "bunch of turkeys": especially if we were doing something we shouldn't and getting into trouble. Of course, we weren't "turkeys" just in November. We could manage to get into mischief any time of year.

It is not just kids, like my friends and me, who are "turkeys" in the way my friend's father used the word. Being a turkey comes from wrongdoing. And Romans 3:23 states that "all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God." Reworded into my friend's dad's language, "all are turkeys and fall short of the glory of God." This means that you and I are turkeys, too.

November is a pretty rough month to be a turkey. I cannot imagine any other month being the cause of the end of more turkeys than November. Romans 6:23 says that "the wages of sin is death." The end result for a turkey is death – for most turkeys, it means becoming someone's dinner, but for us, it means that sin has caused us corruption and death.

There is an interesting custom carried out by the President of the United States as well as some governors. Each year, the leader takes an ordinary turkey and gives it a pardon – it is spared from becoming a meal, spared from the death intended for it. This custom somewhat serves as an analogy for the pardon that all of us "turkeys" receive from our Lord Jesus. We also receive a pardon, but instead of being spared from becoming a holiday meal, we "turkeys" are spared from sin, death, and hell. The pardon that our Lord won for us by His death on the cross and His rising from the dead means that our sins are forgiven. We are no longer "turkeys," but sons and daughters of our Heavenly Father, and heirs of the kingdom of His grace. Because we have been remade, not as turkeys but as children of God, death and hell cannot hold us. Instead, God has promised us resurrection and everlasting life with Him. The pardon that our Lord grants to "turkeys" like us is cause for great Thanksgiving.

This November, we celebrate the holiday of Thanksgiving. As Christians, we truly have a lot to be thankful for, and we know to whom we give that thanks. We don't just speak about how, in general, we are thankful for this, that, or the other thing. Instead, we give thanks to our Almighty God, who has created us, redeemed us, and who provides us with all good things to support this body and life.

Make giving thanks to the Lord part of your Thanksgiving celebration plans. He's the One who provided that turkey that you plan to eat, who gave you the gift of family to enjoy the day with, who created football so that you could spend half the day watching it (if that's your thing), and has given you life and breath all your days. We will have Thanksgiving Eve worship at Trinity at 6 pm on November 22, and I would love to give thanks to our gracious and merciful Lord with you!
