From the Pastor's Desk:

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

I hope you are having a good summer! As I write this, next week is the celebration of the Fourth of July. As a nation, we celebrate independence and the freedoms we enjoy as citizens of this land. As Christians, the day perhaps calls for us also to recognize and give thanks for the giver of the gifts.

That being said, each week we gather to give thanks to the giver of the gifts in the Divine Service. The Divine Service is an interesting label to attach to our gatherings on Sundays. A great many other traditions might simply call that time "worship." Why do we call it the Divine Service? "Divine" denotes something essential to the whole enterprise: that God is involved and indeed is at the center of the things that take place. But the term "service?" Who exactly is it that does the serving?

Primarily, I would argue, our Triune God does the serving. Within the Divine Service, God gives His gifts to us. In the Invocation, we remember God's gifts in baptism and all His promises to us. In the Holy Absolution, He forgives our sins. In the reading of the Scriptures, He serves us with His Word. Likewise, in the sermon, He places His Word into the context of our lives. He serves us the very body and blood that were given and shed for our salvation in the Lord's Supper, and with these elements we receive forgiveness, life, and salvation. Even in the Benediction, the blessing of our God is placed upon us, just as once it was placed upon Israel (Numbers 6:24-26). In the midst of all of this, the Holy Spirit does His work of creating, sustaining, and strengthening saving faith within us that unites us to Christ and to His cross and resurrection. These things might be accomplished using earthly elements and the mouth and hands of the pastor, but all this is at the command of our Lord. In the Divine Service, our Triune God does the serving.

But the serving does not end there. God serves us with His Word and with His grace. God gives, and we receive. Then, we who have received return praise and thanks to Him. We sing hymns that praise God for His works and confess our faith. We confess our sins and our need for what God gives. We pray to God to ask Him for grace and mercy and to thank Him for all He has done. We praise God in liturgical elements such as the Gloria, the Sanctus, and the Nunc Dimittis. In the Creed, we confess our belief in what God has revealed to us about Himself. We give of what God has given us in service to the ministry of the Word and the body of believers with our offerings.

God gives and we receive, and then we return praise and thanks to Him. God serves us, and then we "serve" in return. But even our service often consists of returning to God what He has given to us. We use God's own words to praise Him, His own self-revelation to confess Him, His gifts He has given in offering to Him. Our service is a confession (in Greek, homologeo), which means to say the same thing.

The whole process is important for us. It is important that we are the recipients of God's service – vital, actually. In God's service for us alone, in the work Christ and by the work of the Holy Spirit, do we have life. There is salvation in none other (Acts 4:12). Our service to God gives us the chance to recognize this. It is intentionally denying what our sinful nature would have us embrace. The Divine Service is an opportunity for us to believe, confess, and live out, from start to finish, the truth that God is God and I am not. And this is an important aspect of Godly living, but also of peaceful living.

God gives, and we receive. Because of this, we return praise and thanks to Him. Alleluia! Please be sure to be present with the body of believers here at Trinity each week. Your presence, your service, is a blessing to me, as I pray mine is to you, all because our Triune God's service is a blessing to all of us.
