#### Trinity Lutheran Church & School Endowment Fund

Annual Report

August 22, 2024

- Current Market Value of the Endowment Funds as of 6-30-24 Outreach Fund - \$130,404.49 Church Property Maintenance - \$1,858,409.01 (includes \$300,000 in cash that was withdrawn in August to be used for the parking lot project)
- Earnings disbursed from the Endowment Funds during 2023 for use in 2024 Outreach Fund of \$3,244.34 + carryover from 2022 of \$1,369.42 for a total of \$4,613.76. Church Property Maintenance - \$50,000.00

Outreach Fund Grant Applications Approved for disbursement in 2024 to enhance the Mission Outreach efforts for Trinity Lutheran Church & School TLC School Board - \$902.50 – t-shirts for current and future TLC

TLC School Board - \$902.50 – t-shirts for current and future TLC Preschool students

Homeschool Co-op - \$200.00 – support, educate and provide outreach to the families in the homeschool co-op

Pastor Lieske - \$406.08 - mugs for visitors

Stacey Larsen - \$307.28 – The Story Bibles for children in MWF class and The Kid's Bible for children in TR class.

Pastor Lieske – \$500.00 – Public brochures and Visitor brochures Quilters/Crafters/Orphan Grain Train Mission -\$1,200.00 - purchase supplies for quilts, stocking caps, mittens, scarves and special needs kits.

Remaining funds to be disbursed - \$1,097.90

Church Property Maintenance Fund

- Earnings from 2023 of \$50,000.00 will be utilized for the parking lot project.
- An additional \$300,000.00 was approved and disbursed from the balance of the Church Property Maintenance Fund to be utilized for the parking lot project.
- The annual disbursements of \$50,000.00 for the next three years will be utilized for the parking lot project.

Other activities

We had a Zoom meeting with Mark Cannon, CFO of the LCMS Foundation, to do our annual review/due diligence with them regarding the Endowment Funds. We have also continued changing our fund allocation due to the long term nature of the Endowment Funds.

#### LAMP 2024 Trip to Norway House

There were 13 volunteer missionaries who joined God's mission to Norway House in the summer of 2024. The team included Nadine Drevlow, David Hauser, Ken & Toni Erlandson, Pastor Bill Aufdenkamp (Elbow Lake), Sam Martin (Two Harbors, MN), Michael & Sheila Sandell (Taylors Falls, MN), Robert Nelson (Bismarck, ND), Shahida Luman (Winnipeg), Zoey Brightnose (Winnipeg), Michael Wilshusen (Mora, Missouri), and Dave Schneeberger. The group was absolutely amazing and worked so well together as we taught VBS at three churches in Norway House. We split into two teams to teach at the Anglican Church and Catholic Church simultaneously and then joined together in one group at the United Church for another session. We also had some assistance from two volunteers in the community who helped with the advance preparations as well as the VBS sessions. We touched the lives of 106 children at VBS during the week in addition to numerous other children and adults during a Family Night event where we had games, prizes, Bible bingo, snacks and lemonade. We were also hosted by members of the Anglican Church with a fish fry supper on our last night in the community. It was an amazing week with a lot of positive experiences expressed by all of the volunteers whether they had been in Norway House for a number of years or if it was their first time in the north. It's hard to believe it has been 15 years since we began this journey with the communities of Norway House and Shamattawa and look forward to continuing to grow these relationships for many years to come. Thanks also to all of our prayer and financial supporters who have been so diligent and committed to making this outreach effort a reality. To God be the glory!
