Dear Friends in Christ,		

If we reckon holidays as days that the postal service doesn't deliver mail, or days that the federal government has declared as holidays, then January 1st is a Holiday. It is New Year's Day, though sometimes it maybe could be re-titled National Sleeping-In Day. When I was growing up, it was official College Football Bowl Day, though now those games have been spread over the course of the first week-plus of January. I am sure many families have other traditions that surround New Year's Day as well.

If we reckon holidays as "holy-days," or days when the church celebrates a festival... then January 1st is still a holiday. But the festival is not New Year's Day – after all, the new Church Year begins with the first Sunday in Advent, which is always in November or December. No, the holy day that the church celebrates on January 1st is The Circumcision of Our Lord.

The way that the Hebrew people reckoned days in the time of the Scripture was to count both the beginning and ending date of a period of time. While we would say that January 1 is seven days after Christmas, it would be the date that Christ would have been circumcised, in keeping with the law of the Lord. Way back in Genesis 17:10, the Lord made a covenant between Abraham and Himself. The sign of the covenant was to be this – that every male among the descendants of Abraham would be circumcised. What the children of Abraham would receive is grace and blessing from God and reconciliation with the Lord. Circumcision marked them as one of the Lord's redeemed, and made them children of the promise. The promises that the Almighty Lord had made with His people were fulfilled when that Almighty One took on human flesh, became incarnate, and was born of the Virgin on that glorious Christmas night.

If circumcision was a sign of reconciliation with God, why would Jesus be circumcised? After all, He did not need to be reconciled. Among all people, it was Him alone who did not bear the stain of sin. He did not need to be marked as one of God's people. For He alone had never rebelled against the Lord. So why would He be circumcised?

He was circumcised for the same reason He was baptized – to fulfill all righteousness for us. For all that He did, He did for us. Each step of His earthly life, Jesus participated in our earthly life, and circumcision was no different. But He did each thing with perfect righteousness, accomplishing all for us that we could not accomplish for ourselves. Apart from Christ, our lives are a shadow of what God had created us to be, clouded over by sin and death. In the life of Christ, we discover true humanity, the humanity of Eden, the humanity unstained by sin. His circumcision

was a step of His journey from the cradle to the cross, where He completed His work of restoring true humanity to each of us by overcoming sin, death, and the devil, once and for all.

Since Christ was circumcised for us, since He lived and died and rose again for us, we no longer are required to be circumcised. Instead of God's people (or at least the males among God's people) being marked in our flesh by the cut of the blade, now Christ marks His people with His cross, which was applied to each of us when we were baptized. Marked by the cross, we are reconciled to God by the shed blood of Christ, and we now live in the right-eousness, innocence, and blessedness He has granted to us.

I pray that the Lord's richest blessings would be bestowed to you this new year, as we all live under the cross of our Savior, Jesus Christ.

God's mission for Shamattawa

God's plan for our trip to Shamattawa was evident from the start in spite of the planning we had done. The three previous flights into Shamattawa from Winnipeg had been unable to land due to low cloud cover and it appeared that was going to be the case again as we made our approach to the runway and had to pull up for the same reason. We made a second pass and God's hand became clear as we were able to successfully find the runway. Randy Heide and Michael Gillingham, LAMP missionaries, Robert Nelson from Bismarck who had also joined our summer VBS team to Norway House and Dave Schneeberger had the opportunity to spend time with the children and adults in Shamattawa. The landscape had changed once again since we were here last as the band office and fire hall had been destroyed by fire as we made our way to the school in the back of the pickup. We met the new school administration and discussed the plan for our time in the school. The school day was almost over, but the opportunity presented itself for us to spend time with the high school math students. As Pastor Randy was sharing the Christmas story and a message of hope, other students kept coming into the room as the teacher invited them in and soon the room was full. After Michael the musician rocked the room with a couple of songs, we handed out a few items and were saving goodbye to the group when a few of the former VBS kids stuck around to visit while others had questions and spent some time in deeper discussion. Michael and Bob had a conversation with one of the young men who asked some pretty deep questions about God and his love for people. Michael said he appreciated his training as a church worker and his ability to remember some Bible verses and also Luther's comments on the issue of predestination and the mysteries of God's knowledge and power when that question came up. He also appreciated the comments Bob made and his ability to address the issue in another way while making some complicated theological ideas easier to grasp and understand.

We started the next day helping serve breakfast to the kids as they arrived at school. We were able to spend time in most of the classes from Nursery to Grade 7 where Pastor Randy shared the Christmas story message using The Christmas Journey booklet from Lutheran Hour Ministries, Michael led the classes in two songs and we gave coloring sheets, cross key chains, Christmas activity booklets and knit stocking caps (toques) that had been handcrafted with love from our Trinity Lutheran knitters, to each of the children. A funeral resulted in the school being closed on our last day which provided us the opportunity to spend time straightening up the books in the library for them and were given a tour of some areas of the community I had never seen before as one of the teachers took us on a longer, more scenic route to the airport. It was truly a blessing to spend time with the kids and adults in the community, to see their smiling faces and receive their hugs, to catch up with some of kids who have attended VBS in the past, to strengthen relationships and to share the Christmas message of Jesus with all of the students in the classrooms.

Our ability to have the opportunity to continue this mission and outreach is immeasurable with the seeds we plant each time we come in contact with the children and adults in the Shamattawa community. Thanks to the members of Trinity Lutheran Church and School for your prayer and financial support as well as your knitting efforts in making this mission possible. Your continued prayers for the community and school leaders who are working to make a difference and for the children and other adults to remain receptive to God's ministry and mission for Shamattawa are greatly appreciated.
