



Dear Friends in Christ,

Trinity Lutheran Church in Fergus Falls has for its entire history been a member congregation of The Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod. That might make you curious about the LCMS. What is the LCMS all about? We could answer that question historically, focusing on the origins of the Synod, its spread in the 1800s and 1900s, and its position within both American and global Lutheranism in the past and today. We could also answer the question doctrinally, focusing on our clear confession that the written Word of God (Old and New Testaments) is the only rule and norm of faith and practice, and that the documents contained in the Book of Concord are a true and unadulterated statement and confession of the Word of God. But a current event leads me to want to answer the question ecclesiastically.

The Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod is a church body, or a denomination. That means it is a body of congregations joined together in a common confession of the faith for mutual support and encouragement. The LCMS is organized into 35 districts across the United States (along with a small number of congregations in Canada), and has partner churches all over the world. The headquarters of the Synod is near St. Louis, Missouri, and the current President of the Synod is President Matthew Harrison. The church body also is served by two Seminaries and a number of Universities.

The Synod has a number of officers and boards that carry out operational work for the church body on a day to day basis. However, the chief authority of the Synod is invested in its members, and is exercised in conventions. The term member is used in a very specific way here. The LCMS has always sought to maintain a balance of authority invested in congregations and in pastors. Accordingly, congregations are members of Synod, and pastors are members of Synod (as are commissioned ministers, though these are not able to be voting members). When conventions meet, the assembly is made up of delegates. For national conventions, each electoral circuit selects one pastoral delegate and one lay delegate. The National Convention is held on a three-year cycle. The next National Convention will be held in 2026 in Phoenix.

As mentioned above, Synod is divided into Districts. Trinity is part of the Minnesota North District of the LCMS. I mentioned earlier a “current event” that led to me writing this article, and that current event is our District Convention, which met February 23-25 in Grand Rapids. At the District Convention, each parish (sometimes one congregation, other times a grouping of a number of congregations) is entitled to send a pastoral delegate and a lay delegate.

The District Convention is an opportunity for worship and study of the Word of God together, but also a time to carry out the “business” of the District, such as selecting various officers for the District and also addressing matters. These conventions are also held every third year, the year before the National Convention.

At the time I am writing this, the convention is next week. Gary Schmidt and I will be representing Trinity at the convention. By the time you read this, it may well be past. But I am confident that it will be an edifying experience and that the “business” of the church will be attended to, so that the congregations can continue to do their work of giving and receiving God’s gifts in Christ. Let me know if you have any questions about the convention or about Synod. I’d be happy to try to answer them.

Dear Trinity Family,


