Dear Friends in Christ,

You celebrate Christmas, right? How come? Now, you might be honest if you were to answer because you like Christmas music, or the Christmas spirit, or there's just nothing better to do in the darkest days of December, but the reason we celebrate Christmas is that the second person of the Trinity, the eternal Son of God, took on human flesh to dwell among us. That is a big deal – Immanuel, God with us.

Boy, do I have a deal for you! Because if "Immanuel," God with us, is a reason we celebrate Christmas, then the Feast of Pentecost, celebrated this year on June 8, may as well be treated as "Christmas Two." We read the account of the event in Acts 2.

In that passage, the disciples are gathered together in Jerusalem. Jesus had just ascended into heaven ten days earlier, and maybe they are trying to figure out what comes next. Before He ascended, Jesus had told them, "you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now." And then later, "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses." And sure enough, on that day of Pentecost, the Lord's words were fulfilled. "Suddenly there came from heaven a sound like a mighty rushing wind, and it filled the whole house where they were staying. And divided tongues as of fire appeared to them and rested on reach one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit."

At Christmas, we rejoice that God dwells within man in flesh. At Pentecost, we rejoice that God dwells within man in Spirit.

For this is who the Holy Spirit is – the third person of the Holy Trinity, proceeding from the Father and the Son to carry out the work entrusted to Him, work that the Spirit still dwells within man to complete today, even within and among us.

The Word became flesh and dwelled among us! Merry Christmas! The Spirit of God is poured out upon all flesh and dwells in us! Merry Pentecost!

This is cause for celebration, for a very important reason. There is no SALVATION for us without the Word becoming flesh. But there is no salvation FOR US if not for the Holy Spirit being poured out upon all flesh.

For it is the Holy Spirit who works in us to create, strengthen, and sustain faith in us. This work that the Spirit does in us is of utmost importance. Because it is the Spirit's work alone that joins us to Jesus in a way that delivers salvation to us, specifically, personally, directly. We cannot do it on our own – remember what Luther teaches in the explanation to the Third Article of the Creed: "I believe I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him." It is by the Spirit's work in us, as He works through the means of grace, that we receive the grace of God. >>>

On Pentecost day we celebrate and rejoice that the eternal third person of the Holy Trinity, the Holy Spirit who proceeds from the Father and the Son, has deigned to dwell in humanity – in us. Now we are temples of the Holy Spirit, places where God and man meet. If you are going to celebrate Christmas, you ought to celebrate Pentecost, Christmas two, also. There is no better way than in rejoicing in the Spirit's gifts – the word proclaimed, the sacraments delivered. We can do that on June 8, but also every Sunday.

## Meet the Trinity Family



Dave and Esther Schlicker joined Trinity in 2010 after retiring. Trinity quickly put them into serving Jesus in various ways, teaching 5<sup>th</sup> & 6<sup>th</sup> Bible History class, teaching Sunday school, leading Men's Network, Stephen Ministry, School Board, Board of Christian Education, LWML, playing organ and, and, and......

Dave was a teacher and principal for 42 years in Lutheran Elementary schools in Crown, MN; Suring, WI; Readlyn, IA; Dearborn, MI; and Cologne, MN. Some of his responsibilities included coaching sports of every kind including cheerleading! He taught Kindergarten and all eight grades throughout the years but not all at the same time, thank goodness. His largest class was 30 eighth graders in Michigan and 30 6-8<sup>th</sup> graders in a windowless room the first year he taught in Cologne, MN. Always interesting that some boys don't believe in deodorant! He served on many school accreditation teams including Trinity Lutheran School!

Esther taught in Isanti Public Elementary School for two and a half years, stayed at home for 14 years with the kids, and taught 22 years in Lutheran schools in Readlyn, IA; Westland, MI; and Cologne, MN. Her responsibilities often included music! Never coaching sports, thank goodness!

Dave and Esther have four children and 12 grandchildren. Their kids live in four different states which include Minnesota, New York, Indiana, and Nevada. As many of you are aware, this gives them opportunities to travel!

Dave was born in Texas, but grew up in Illinois and Michigan. His dad was an LCMS pastor. He has 6 siblings, three of which are with Jesus in heaven. His goal in life was to NOT be a pastor! He attended Concordia, Ann Arbor, for two years and Concordia, Seward, NE, for two years, graduating with a Bachelor of Science degree and Lutheran Teacher Certification. He returned to Seward to get his master's degree, taking summer classes. An exciting achievement was going to state in pole vault as a senior in high school.

Esther was born in southwest Minnesota where she lived until going to college at Concordia Seward, NE. Her dad was a farmer, so she was privileged (more

like obligated) to help with milking cows and doing chicken chores. One of the farm chores she loved was driving the tractor for baling hay and other field work. She is number nine of ten children, four are with Jesus! Her oldest living sibling is 95, way older that her!!! She graduated from Concordia Seward. Her summer job during her college years was working for a Campbell Soup Company where she removed meat from the bones of chickens; not a pleasant job. She claims that Campbells is still using the chicken she threw many years ago as there is very little in each can! Esther played on the Walther League girls softball team for five years, starting between 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> grades, playing third base.
