Dear friends in Christ,

When I was a student in college, we studied a book called "God's No and God's Yes: the Proper Distinction Between Law and Gospel," which was an abridgement of an important work in the history of the LCMS, C.F.W. Walther's Law and Gospel. Walther's Law and Gospel is important because it sets forth an understanding of how to engage the sacred scriptures, particularly how to distinguish between that Word of God which kills (God's Law) and that which makes alive (God's Gospel). It is not that one is true and one false, but rather that both are true and important to understand – but also important to distinguish.

However, it is the title of the abridged book that I want to draw your attention to: God's No and God's Yes. The reason why is this: I think in our world today (and maybe it has always been this way), we get so caught up in all of the many ways that there are folks who wish to say "yes" to God's "no" that we ourselves sometimes lose sight of our calling to give our whole-hearted "yes" to God's "yes." In other words, it can seem so vital that we get God's "no" out to the world (and to ourselves) that we lose sight of the fact that God's yes is intended for our good and is a way in which God grants great blessings to us and to the world.

Allow me to provide you an example. It may seem that, in many ways, marriage is under attack. It might be really easy for the way that we as Christians speak about marriage to be restricted to "God says 'no' to same-sex marriage, to no fault divorce, to extramarital sexuality," this list could go on and on. But allowing the conversation to be framed in such a way prevents us from speaking of the beauty of "Therefore a man shall leave his father and his mother and hold fast to his wife, and they shall become one flesh" (Genesis 2:25), and all the blessings God grants when we embrace God's vision for marriage and sexuality.

Likewise, conversations about the roles of man and women in the family and society, while important to have, often are reduced to "you can't do this, this, and this." But what is left out is the sense of calling, and that man and women in marriage and society are called to different roles and functions, which complement one another in such a way as to be a blessing to one another and to the world.

The list can go on. My point is this: God's "yes" is good for you. It is something to embrace, to celebrate, to pursue. That should be just as clear and just as formative for us as the idea that God's "no" is bad for us. As God's "yes" is present in your life, you (and the world around you) will be blessed.

The Rev. Dr. Daniel Jastram serves as a missionary on behalf of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS) in Asia, where he lives with his wife in Tokyo, Japan. In this role, Dr. Jastram coordinates efforts to make Lutheran resources of theology and worship available in all of Japan. He provides regular services at worship sites, plans for and manages translation work of theological resources, and nurtures relations with local Lutheran pastors facing individual challenges to the faith. Daniel was born in Shibata, Japan, and was raised overseas in an LCMS missionary family. His childhood congregation was Shibata Lutheran Church. He received his Master of Divinity degree from Concordia Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne. Later, he earned both a master's degree and a doctorate in classical languages from the University of Wisconsin—Madison. Before serving in Asia, he was a professor of theology at Concordia University, St. Paul, St. Paul, Minn., and Concordia University Wisconsin, Mequon, Wis. He also served as sole pastor of Messiah Lutheran Church, Forest Lake, Minn.

In his free time, Daniel enjoys reading, hiking and bookbinding. Joan was born in Mitchell, S.D., where her childhood congregation was Zion Lutheran Church. She received her Doctor of Psychology (Psy.D.) degree from the Minnesota School of Professional Psychology at Argosy University, Twin Cities, Minn. Currently Joan works as a clinical psychologist in private practice in Tokyo. In her free time, she enjoys reading and hiking. Pray for Daniel and Joan as they serve in Asia. Thank our heavenly Father for the blessing of His Word and Sacraments wherever in the world they are proclaimed and administered. Thank our Savior, Jesus Christ, for the truth of His salvation as witnessed in our catechetical theological and worship materials. 
