Dear friends in Christ,

There has been much written about the assassination of Charlie Kirk, much of it demonstrating wisdom, other things demonstrating a lack thereof. There is a lot to say, but maybe for right now it is sufficient to say individuals shooting people because they disagree with the things that they say is evil, apart from a clear word of God. Perhaps there were figures in the Old Testament that had such a word and such a vocation, but none among us today does. That applies whoever is the speaker, whatever is the speech. We don't oppose lies and blasphemies with violence, but with truth.

But that is not what I wanted to write to you about. Instead, I want to write to you about the remarkable thing that happened at the Memorial for Charlie Kirk held Sunday, September 21. Particularly about one thing spoken by Mr. Kirk's widow, Erika. She said, "Our Savior said, 'Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do.' That young man...I forgive him. I forgive him because it was what Christ did, and it's what Charlie would do."

To me, amid many amazing expressions of the Christian faith in the public sphere that have occurred, this is perhaps the most amazing. It demonstrates precisely where the Christian faith and the secular world diverge. The secular world says 'score points,' 'win battles,' 'get revenge,' and a whole lot of other behaviors we've seen on display in the public sphere. Many of the people who wrote about Mr. Kirk's death, from either direction, wrote to advance or defend their position, to cast aspersions on others, and to achieve their own purposes.

Mrs. Kirk did something far different. She forgave the man who stole her husband's life. This cannot have been easy for her. I am sure there is a voice inside her screaming out against this, harboring anger and hatred and a desire for revenge. That voice is the Old Adam in us that clings to sin like a precious jewel.

But Mrs. Kirk instead chose publicly to live out her calling in Christ. She quoted Jesus from the cross as He prayed for His own executioners (Luke 23:34). The same instruction can be found elsewhere: Ephesians 4:32 ("Be kind to one another, tenderhearted,

forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you”) or Colossians 3:13 (“...bearing with one another and, if one has a complaint against another, forgiving each other; as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive”), for example. We even are reminded of this calling time and again when we pray the Lord’s Prayer, asking to be forgiven as we forgive.

A person might read these verses and think that God’s forgiveness is contingent on my forgiveness. But it is better to understand that forgiveness flows out from me for others because forgiveness has been poured out upon me by God for the sake of His Son Jesus Christ. I don’t forgive *so that* I will be forgiven; I forgive *because* I’ve been forgiven. I forgive others continually because they need it, and I can recognize that because I know that I also need to be continually forgiven.

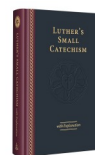
This is a hard calling, but it is God’s calling for us in Christ. Mrs. Kirk demonstrates this calling, as difficult as it may be. It is **hard** to forgive when you’ve been wronged, but it is **good**. Does it matter to the assassin that Mrs. Kirk spoke forgiveness to him? Possibly not. But it is good for the world, it is good for Mrs. Kirk, and it is faithful to God to forgive. It proclaims, among other things, “God, I do not want to contemplate a world without forgiveness, and I pray that You don’t either.”

You live in this world, but you belong to Jesus. You are called to form and shape your life not in the way the world does, but in the way Christ has called you. We are forgiving people, because we are forgiven people. Mrs. Kirk demonstrates this for us. I pray that you also are able to demonstrate this in your own life.

Congregational Catechism Review



*Each week, a portion of Luther’s Small Catechism has been appointed for congregational focus. You are encouraged, as you are able, to meditate on this section of the catechism throughout the week and to commit it to memory. In certain weeks, the portion of the Catechism that we are focusing upon is quite long. While you can certainly review the whole portion, in those weeks focus particularly upon committing the **bolded section** to memory.*

October 5

P From the fourth part on Holy Baptism: *What does such baptizing with water indicate?*

C It indicates that the Old Adam in us should by daily contrition and repentance be drowned and die with all sins and evil desires, and that a new man should daily emerge and arise to live before God in righteousness and purity forever.

October 12

P From the Office of the Keys: *What do you believe according to these words?*

C I believe that when the called ministers of Christ deal with us by His divine command, in particular when they exclude openly unrepentant sinners from the Christian congregation and absolve those who repent of their sins and want to do better, this is just as valid and certain, even in heaven, as if Christ our dear Lord dealt with us Himself.

October 19

P From Confession: *What is Confession?*

C Confession has two parts. First, that we confess our sins, and second, that we receive absolution, that is, forgiveness, from the pastor as from God Himself, not doubting, but firmly believing that by it our sins are forgiven before God in heaven.

October 26

P From the Second Article: *What does this mean?*

C ...[I believe that Jesus] has redeemed me, a lost and condemned person, purchased and won me from all sins, from death, and from the power of the devil; not with gold or silver, but with His holy, precious blood and with His innocent suffering and death...

Recent news from Missionary Kim Buelmann in Germany, who we support through the Together in Mission program:

Christ is alive, and because He lives, we live! In case you were wondering, I am still alive and continue to be incredibly thankful to each of you for your prayers, encouragement and support! It means so much to me, especially during some recent challenging times, as I serve here in Leipzig.

The good news is that God is still working in amazing ways on the mission field! However, things have been a struggle. Since my last home service, I have been facing loss after loss. My Mom passed away, as did many others close to me, including church members and friends. One of my beloved Italian Greyhounds, Elliott, also passed away. The two other LCMS missionaries who were serving with me have now left the field, leaving me as the only one left. In addition, my phone crashed, causing me to lose thousands of photos. The pain of all these losses still cuts deep, and I have been struggling to deal with them amidst the daily challenges of ministry here, which continues to be extremely busy, demanding, and rewarding. Through it all I am reminded how fleeting everything is, and that Christ is all we have to cling to in this life. On Christ, the solid rock, I stand; all other ground is sinking sand!

Kim will be with us to share about her mission work on Sunday, November 2, during Bible class. Please come and hear about her ministry, including her work with refugees who are struggling to connect, learn the language, find work and housing, and to hold fast to the Word, even when facing disappointment and pending deportation. We will enjoy a meal together after her presentation.

Trinity Homeschool Co-op in September

What a great opening month we've had! We have eleven registered families amounting to 27 students, preschool-8th grade (there are also a few toddlers and babies). Our first week was September 9th and the children got to learn Pastor's Bible verse of the month (Psalm 98:4) and the first verse of I Am



Jesus Little Lamb. It's fun to hear the kids engage with pastor during chapel and answer his questions about the day's Bible Story. We are once again blessed with Leon Dawkins assisting with the music for chapel.

Following chapel we have a time for public speaking. Many of the children are reciting Bible verses already!

We are so blessed to have Sylvia Ratcliffe back as our music teacher this year. She is teaching the kids about all the things that go into music. They have a fun rhythm game they've been playing as they learn each other's names and practice keeping a beat. They use rhythm sticks every class (thank you Cal & Helen Johansen for making them!) and have so much fun as they learn. The older children stay for music theory after the younger kids have been dismissed.



In September we got to visit Ringdahl EMS for our fieldtrip. Ringdahl did an amazing job. In addition to a tour of the station and ambulances, they had different stations set up. There was a station to teach the children about CPR. There was second station to practice dressing a wound. The third station gave the kids the opportunity to try packing a deep wound.



For our art project this month, Tenia led our group in tie dying. I had never done that before and it was really neat to learn how the process works. All of the children seemed to have an absolute blast and they are so proud of what they made. For our third week in September, everyone tried to wear their tie dye creations and we got a fun group photo.



Our third week in September our guest speaker was Bobbie Emerine, Naval Radioman 3rd class 1969-72. He talked to the kids about morse code and even brought a device he built himself to demonstrate morse code with a lightbulb. The kids were enthralled and all got to have a turn pressing the tapping device to turn on the light bulb. They even got to learn how to write their names in morse code!



September will end with a free play opportunity so they kids can spend some casual time enjoying each other after music class.
