Dear brothers and sisters in Christ Jesus,

Next year, the 2026 LCMS National Synodical Convention will be held. This convention is held every third year. There are a number of ways that we participate in this convention at the circuit, district, and synod-wide level. At our November Voters Meeting, we will have the opportunity to exercise some of those participatory privileges, so my goal today is to explain various parts of this convention process.

The first step is holding District conventions, which are held the year before Synod convention. Our MN North District convention was held in February of 2025. Each congregation can send a pastoral delegate and a lay delegate to the convention. Gary Schmidt represented Trinity at the convention as lay delegate. One of the functions of the district convention is to identify issues that would be passed along to the synod convention the following year.

It is not the case that every congregation sends delegates to the Synodical convention. That would be a very crowded place (and a very expensive endeavor). Instead, we are represented by delegates from our circuit. The Fergus Falls circuit includes the LCMS congregations in Moorhead, Sabin, Barnesville, Breckenridge, Elizabeth, Friberg, and Fergus Falls. The circuit meets to elect a pastoral delegate and a lay delegate, along with alternates. One interesting rule about this is that the delegates and alternates all have to come from different congregations. All the called pastors in the circuit are on the "ballot" for this election. Lay persons have to be nominated in advance. This meeting was held October 12. Each parish is allowed to send a pastoral and lay delegate to this meeting as well. Gary Schmidt represented Trinity at this meeting. Our circuit elected Pastor Brett Hartwig from Trinity in Sabin to be the pastoral delegate, and David Hauser from Trinity in Fergus Falls to be the lay delegate, representing the Fergus Falls circuit next July in Phoenix.

There are a couple of ways our local congregation is able to participate in the 2026 Synodical convention cycle that we can address at the November Voters meeting. Around 2010, the Synod changed its rules so that the Synod President is elected before the convention rather than at the convention. Each congregation has two

votes – a pastoral vote and a lay vote. The lay vote for a given congregation is exercised by that congregation's lay voter. Our Voters Meeting will be called upon to appoint a lay member of Trinity to serve as our congregation's lay voter. Next year, when it comes to be time to cast votes for Synod President, that individual will cast a vote in the election electronically (instructions will be provided).

To craft a ballot for that and other elections, there need to be nominations. Congregations of the Synod are able to nominate pastors of Synod to serve as Synod President, Synod First Vice-President, and Vice-President from our region (in our case, the Great Plains region, which includes the Montana, Wyoming, North Dakota, South Dakota, Nebraska, Iowa West, MN South, and MN North Districts). The regional VP has to reside in the given region (for reference, our regional VP currently is Rev. Nabil Nour, who lives in South Dakota). At the Voters Meeting we will have the opportunity to make nominations for each of these three positions. We are able to nominate up to two individuals for each position if we so choose. We do not *have to* make any nomination. However, if we wish to as a congregation, this is the way to do so.

I think this mostly covers the whole convention process and how Trinity participates in it, apart from this. One thing we can do as a congregation and each of us as individuals is to pray: Pray for the delegates, for the candidates, for the process, for the LCMS, and for the congregations of the Synod, that God would bless the proclamation of His Word in our congregations and throughout the world. Let's make sure to do that too.

Adopt a Student - We were introduced to Ezekiel Grabau a number of years ago when he was selected as our Adopt-A-Student from Concordia Theological Seminary at Fort Wayne. The following is an abbreviated version of a recent letter from Ezekiel.

The past year has been full of blessings from God. On 6/22/24 I married RuthAnn and we moved to Perry, IA where RuthAnn worked as deaconess

intern for Perry Lutheran Homes. I served under Pastor Joel Newton as vicar at St. Paul Lutheran Church in Ankeny. It was a joy to serve the body of Christ and to practice what I've learned in the seminary: participating in monthly preaching, assisting in services, teaching Bible studies, and visiting the homebound. In August we began renting a farmhouse north of Fort Wayne and I am in the thick of Fall Quarter at the seminary. There are also a flood of applications to fill out, interviews to schedule, and meetings to attend.

I am seriously considering pursuing further studies at the seminary to be better equipped for the ministry and teaching. RuthAnn may then be commissioned in the Spring for diaconal work locally. But none of this is set in stone. Every moment is in anticipation of what comes next. Still we remain thankful to God for his faithfulness to us and confident that His steadfast love endures forever. We will be taking up a collection for Ezekiel in Nov./Dec. to provide him with continued financial support during his final year at the seminary. Keep Ezekiel and his family in your prayers.

Recent news from Missionary Kim Bueltmann in Germany, who we support through the Together in Mission program:

Christ is alive, and because He lives, we live! In case you were wondering, I am still alive and continue to be incredibly thankful to each of you for your prayers, encouragement and support! It means so much to me,

especially during some recent challenging times, as I serve here in Leipzig.

The good news is that God is still working in amazing ways on the mission field! However, things have been a struggle. Since my last home service, I have been facing loss after loss. My Mom passed away, as did many others close to me, including church members and friends. One of my beloved Italian Greyhounds, Elliott, also passed away. The two other LCMS missionaries who were serving with me have now left the field, leaving me as the only one left. In addition, my phone crashed, causing me to lose thousands of photos. The pain of all these losses still cuts deep, and I have been struggling to deal with them amidst the daily challenges of ministry here, which continues to be extremely busy, demanding, and rewarding. Through it all I am reminded how fleeting everything is, and that Christ is all we have to cling to in this life. On Christ, the solid rock, I stand; all other ground is sinking sand!

Kim will be with us to share about her mission work on Sunday, November 2, during Bible class. Please come and hear about her ministry, including her work with refugees who are struggling to connect, learn the language, find work and housing, and to hold fast to the Word, even when facing disappointment and pending deportation. We will enjoy a **potluck meal** together after her presentation.

Fun facts about Kim: *I speak and sing English, German and Farsi! *Silvia and I took a road trip to Bulgaria this summer for our regional missionary gathering. Silvia's 31st country. My 43rd. *One of my favorite dishes to eat in Germany is actually a rice dish from Afghanistan called Kabuli Pulau.
