Dear friends in Christ,

Happy new year! I pray that our Lord Jesus will bless and keep you throughout this gift of time that is 2026.

There are some Biblical events that we don't learn about in Sunday School because the reality of the situations is quite awful. An example of this might be the events of Genesis 19. While I recall learning about the destruction of Sodom and Gomorrah and the fate of Lot's wife in Sunday School, we did not study the visit of the angels before or Lot's conduct with his daughters afterward.

There are other narratives we don't learn about in Sunday School because they are just odd. These rarely show up in the lectionary or your favorite devotional either. One I want to draw your attention to is found in Matthew 17.

In verses 24-27, we read about Peter having a conversation with the folks whose job it was to collect the temple tax. The temple tax was a two-drachma tax that Jewish males paid each year to support the functioning of the temple in Jerusalem. The idea behind it was that, by paying the tax, you participated in the sacrifices offered and the atonement made.

Peter is asked whether his teacher may the tax, and he responds in the affirmative. But then, when he returns to Jesus, Jesus asks him about taxes. His question: "Do kings of the earth take taxes from their sons or strangers?" When Peter answers "Strangers," Jesus remarks "Then the sons are free." This is the point of the short passage, but the odd thing is what comes next.

Jesus instructs Peter to go "hook fishing" (as opposed to "net fishing") and in the mouth of the first fish that comes up, he would find a shekel. Jesus instructs him to take that coin and give it to the tax collectors for Jesus and Peter (a shekel was worth four drachma).

If only we could all pay our taxes with whatever we find in the mouth of a fish! This does not seem to me to be an occasion that calls for a miracle, and yet we'd have to conclude that is what takes place in this text: the miraculous receipt of a coin from an aquatic donor.

Immediately before this whole event (24-27), Jesus had shared with His disciples another of His predictions of His passion, telling them He would be delivered into the hands of men who would kill Him, and on the third day He would rise.

Paying the temple tax carries with it the idea that you are supplying for your own atoning sacrifice. You are paying to support the work that makes satisfaction with God. Jesus declaring that He was about to be handed over to death was stating for His disciples yet again that God was providing for the atoning sacrifice. The sons are free, as in, they did not need to supply for their own satisfaction before God. God was doing so for them, providing the pure, spotless lamb who would take away the sins of the whole world: Jesus.

So as to not cause scandal to those who are still paying the tax, the Lord accounts for Himself and Peter, but even in this miracle, Peter provides nothing. God gives, he receives. This is how it is for us with all things. Thanks be to God who puts coins in the mouths of fish and also provides for all our needs of body and soul.

Holy Baptism - Fourth

Where is this written?

St. Paul writes in Romans, chapter six: "We were therefore buried with Him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life." (Romans 6:4)

January 18

The Sixth Commandment

You shall not commit adultery.

What does this mean?

We should fear and love God so that we lead a sexually pure and decent life in what we say and do, and husband and wife love and honor each other.

January 25

The Second Article

What does this mean?

I believe that Jesus Christ, true God, begotten of the Father from eternity, and also true man, born of the virgin Mary, is my Lord, who has redeemed me, a lost and condemned person, purchased and won me from all sins, from death, and from the power of the devil; not with gold or silver, but with His holy, precious blood and with His innocent suffering and death, that I may be His own and live under Him in His kingdom and serve Him in everlasting righteousness, innocence, and blessedness, just as He is risen from the dead, lives and reigns to all eternity.

Lutheran Braille Workers (LBW) is committed to providing Christian materials in braille and specialized large print worldwide at no cost.

With a part of the grant funds, LBW will establish five new Ministry Production Centers in the United States. This grant will allow LBW to produce and freely distribute approximately 10,000 additional volumes of Bibles and other Christian materials.

God's Mission for Shamattawa

It had been about a year since we had the opportunity to spend time with the children and adults in Shamattawa. It was also very evident that winter had already set in as the team landed in the snowy north. Rev. Keith and Sylvia Ratcliffe along with Randy Heide, LAMP missionary, joined Dave Schneeberger on God's mission to Shamattawa. We settled into the school where we would stay during our time in the community and discussed the plan for our time in the school.



Over the next three days we started the day by helping serve breakfast to the kids as they arrived at school. It was a great way for them to see us in action and for us to hear their comments and see their smiling faces. We were able to spend time in most of the classes where Pastor Randy shared a message about GRACE – God's Riches At Christ's Expense and told the children we all make mistakes and are not perfect, but God has forgiven those mistakes when he sent Jesus to shed his blood, die on the cross and rise again so we can have eternal life with him in heaven. He also reminded them that God doesn't make junk! We handed out bead cross necklaces and Pastor Keith shared the explanation for the cross and each of the bead colors. Sylvia led the classes in two songs and we gave coloring sheets, Christmas activity booklets and knit stocking caps (toques) that had been handcrafted with love from our Trinity Lutheran knitters, to each of the children. We also handed out Pocket Prayer Quilts to some of the older kids and adults made by one of our Norway House volunteers, Sheila Sandell, and her prayer group.



It was another amazing year for us to spend time with the kids and adults in the community, to see their smiling faces and receive their hugs, to catch up with some of the kids who have attended VBS in the past, to strengthen relationships and to share the message of Jesus with all of the students in the classrooms. Pastor Keith and Sylvia shared how this trip helped them realize how much they missed going to remote areas to share Jesus with the children and adults in those communities and are looking forward to returning to Shamattawa and/or Norway House if given the opportunity in the future.

We are so blessed to have the opportunity to continue this mission and outreach with the children and adults we connect with in the Shamattawa school and community with the seeds we plant through our contacts. Thanks to the members of Trinity Lutheran Church and School for your prayer and financial support as well as your knitting efforts in making this mission possible. Your continued prayers for the community and school leaders who are working to make a difference and for the children and other adults to remain receptive to God's ministry and mission for Shamattawa are greatly appreciated.
