Dear friends in Christ,

February is a time when people ponder that wonder that is *amore*, the Italian word for love. The reason why is no great mystery, being the month where we celebrate Valentine's Day, giving great attention to romance as we do so. Movies, songs, books, and all other sort of media try to convey to us that strong feelings of affection (or sometimes lust) is the greatest love that there is.

The Lord Jesus teaches us differently. In John 15, there is a great discourse where Jesus speaks of Himself as the vine and His followers as the branches. In verse 12, He states, "This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you." Then, he proceeds to speak of the greatest love. In verse 13, "Greater love has no one than this, that someone lay down his life for his friends."

Jesus speaks of *agape*, nor *amore*. *Agape* is the most often used word for "love" in the Greek New Testament. It is not a word centered on feeling and emotion, but on commitment and dedication. *Agape* love is love that will do what is right or needed for another no matter the cost or sacrifice it might bring. Images of *agape* might include an exhausted mother getting up in the middle of the night to help a sick child, because the child needs it. Another vision of this *agape* can be seen in the parable of the Good Samaritan, where the Samaritan man helps the beaten Jewish man, even though their cultures make them enemies.

While *agape* love can be present where romantic love is present as well, absent from this concept is any sort of infatuation or self-serving. This is commitment through and through. There is a quote from Dietrich Bonhoeffer from a wedding sermon: "It is not your love that sustains the marriage, but from now on, the marriage that sustains your love." Anyone who has lived long enough has experienced the fact that feelings are fickle. The kind of love that Christ calls for us to show to others, and particularly to our families, is to be anything but fickle. It is to be *agape*. It is to be a commitment to love one another, built upon the fact that Christ has loved us.

Dear friends, *agape* one another as Christ has *agape*-d you. The Lord will give you all manner of opportunities to do so, at home, at church, in the community.

Lent will be starting with Ash Wednesday on February 18. We will have midweek services again each week at 11 and 6. This penitential season gives us great opportunity both to consider our own sinful state but also to marvel in the *agape* of Christ for us as He lays down His life for us, His friends.

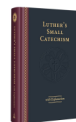

February 1

Confession *What is Confession?*

Confession has two parts. First, that we confess our sins, and second, that we receive absolution, that is, forgiveness, from the pastor as from God Himself, not doubting, but firmly believing that by it our sins are forgiven before God in heaven.

February 8

The Third Commandment

Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy. *What does this mean?*

We should fear and love God so that we do not despise preaching and His Word, but hold it sacred and gladly hear and learn it.

February 15

The Office of the Keys *What is the Office of the Keys?*

The Office of the Keys is that special authority which Christ has given to His Church on earth to forgive the sins of repentant sinners, but to withhold forgiveness from the unrepentant as long as they do not repent.

February 22

The Sixth Petition

And lead us not into temptation.

Lead us not into temptation. What does this mean?

God tempts no one. We pray in this petition that God would guard and keep us so that the devil, the world, and our sinful nature may not deceive us or mislead us into false belief, despair, and other great shame and vice. Although we are attacked by these things, we pray that we may finally overcome them and win the victory.

We greet you with gratitude and with thanksgiving to God for His many blessings!

In October, we gathered in Echigo Yuzawa for a Lutheran theological conference focused on the doctrine of Justification. Our keynote speaker, LCMS Wyoming District President John Hill, led us in thoughtful teaching and discussion. Between sessions, meals, and worship, conversations continued as friendships were strengthened and encouragement was shared. Once again, we were reminded how God uses these times together to support those laboring in often-isolated settings.

This fall also brought an important milestone with the arrival of our first LCMS vicar assigned to Japan in more than fifty years. After many months of preparation, Vicar Zachary Turley arrived in November and began settling into life and ministry here.

Since his arrival, he has joined worship at several sites and begun language studies. We are thankful for the Lord's provision of additional help for the work here and for the many people whose efforts and prayers helped bring this about.

We continue to encourage Japanese pastors, support translation efforts, and accompany Chinese Christians and immigrants in the Tokyo area as they grow in worship and catechesis. We are especially mindful that this work is never carried out alone. We give thanks to God for you and for the partnership we share in Christ's mission.

There will be a congregational potluck Sunday, Feb. 8th. Please bring your favorite dish to share.



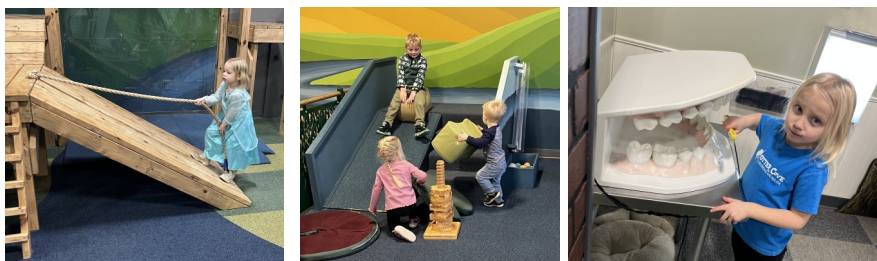
