Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As near as I can tell, there has not been a youth confirmation at Trinity since 2019. We look forward to seeing that change this month, and give thanks to God.

On May 3, six young people from our congregation will participate in the Rite of Confirmation and publicly confess the faith of their baptism before the congregation. What a joy it is to mark this milestone of the church carrying out its mission and purpose and promise, a task taken on when these young people were baptized into the faith. At that point, it became the responsibility of Christ's church to support the parents of these children in nurturing them in the Christian faith. We rejoice that, after having been instructed in the faith, these youth will confess that faith and continue to walk together with our congregation in receiving the gifts of forgiveness, life, and salvation that Jesus freely gives us.

At the same time, this occasion is a reminder to each of us that we are to be lifelong hearers and learners of the Word of God. One of the points that was made to the students in their confirmation interviews was that the Rite of Confirmation does not conclude anything; rather, it is an invitation into a lifetime of continuing to learn and grow in Christ. By God's grace, may that be the case for each of us, as we continue to walk with Jesus and He leads us by His Word and Spirit and nurtures us with His Word and Sacraments.

There is also a joyful personal milestone in this confirmation class, as I will have my first opportunity to confirm a person that I had baptized as a baby. More than that, it is my very own daughter. It is a joy for me to see how that same faith that was given her on her 12<sup>th</sup> day when she was baptized, once planted has now blossomed and continues to bear fruit in her life.

Likewise, I am grateful for each of the six students in our class and the opportunity that I have had over these past four years to walk them through the great narratives of the Bible and to study Luther's Small Catechism with them. It will be a joy to give to each of them the precious body and blood of Jesus, and to continue to watch them learn and grow in faith for years to come.

Let me encourage you to keep each of these six students and all the children of our congregation in your prayers. The Evil One means them woe, just as he does each of us, but we pray that the Good Shepherd would guard and keep His sheep all their days.

## Congregational Catechism Review



Each week, a portion of Luther's Small Catechism has been appointed for congregational focus. You are encouraged, as you are able, to meditate on this section of the catechism throughout the week and to commit it to memory.

### May 3 - Holy Baptism - Second

*What benefits does Baptism give?*

It works forgiveness of sins, rescues from death and the devil, and gives eternal salvation to all who believe this, as the words and promises of God declare.

### May 10 - The Second Commandment

You shall not misuse the name of the Lord your God.

*What does this mean?*

We should fear and love God so that we do not curse, swear, use satanic arts, lie, or deceive by His name, but call upon it in every trouble, pray, praise, and give thanks.

### May 17 - The Third Article

*What does this mean?*

**I believe that I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him; but the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the true faith.**

In the same way He calls, gathers, enlightens, and sanctifies the whole Christian Church on earth, and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one true faith.

Asia-Japan news from Pastor Dan and Joan Jastram - The Jastram's continue to serve at five ministry sites with varying frequency ranging from weekly to once a month. Last year Pastor Dan began monthly home visitation to their Osaka Worship location for catechesis and worship. This outreach has now resulted in an adult confirmation and another LCMS member has joined the gathering there.

Their relationship with Vicar Zachary Turley has continued to grow as he has settled into a regular schedule of worship assistance and evangelistic outreach at the various locations of Word and Sacrament ministry being served by Pastor Dan and Joan Jastram. This includes language learning and outreach at our LCMS sister congregation where he lives.

Pastor Dan continues to make headway on the newest translation project of Luther's Small Catechism with Explanation and is about 50% completed.

We are excited to have Pastor Dan and Joan join us for our mission festival Sunday later this summer when he will be preaching and they will be providing us with an update on their ministry in Japan-Asia.
