Dear friends in Christ,

The doctrine of the Holy Trinity is one we confess by faith, not because we fully comprehend the doctrine (or the nature of God) inside and out, but because it is consistent with the teaching of the Scriptures. The Bible teaches “one God in Trinity and Trinity in Unity,” to use the language of the Athanasian Creed.

There are those who would argue against Trinitarian doctrine, and one basis for their argument is that the term Trinity does not appear in the Bible. This is a true statement, but it is not that particularly relevant or profound. The claim of the Christian church is to confess what the Scriptures teach: that the Father is God, the Son is God, and the Holy Spirit is God; the Father is not the Son, the Son is not the Holy Spirit, the Holy Spirit is not the Father; and that there is only one God. All of these statements are true, according to the Word of God. The issue lies with our own reason, which cannot always make sense of the things of God. But we can *confess* the things of God, even accepting that they are a mystery to us.

There are, however, certain “classic” texts that do present Trinitarian truth. One example would be Matthew 28:19, where Jesus instructs the disciples to baptize “in the name of the **Father** and of the **Son** and of the **Holy Spirit**.” Likewise, 2 Corinthians 13:14, where Paul ends his letter with the benediction, “The grace of the **Lord Jesus Christ** and the love of **God** and the fellowship of the **Holy Spirit** be with you all.”

In a similar way, there are passages where we see the persons of the Trinity in action. One of these is the creation account in Genesis 1, where **God [the Father]** creates “the heavens and the earth” (1:1), the **Spirit of God** hovers over the face of the waters (1:2), and the **Word of God** (equated with Jesus in John 1:1) speaks all things into being (“and God said” 1:3). Similarly, at the Baptism of our Lord, where the **Son, Jesus**, is in the water (Matthew 3:14 ff), the **Spirit of God** descends upon Him (Matthew 3:16), and the **Father** speaks “This is my beloved Son” (Matthew 3:17).

If you have utilized the King James Version of the Bible, you may have 1 John 5:7 in mind at this point, which in the KJV reads “for there are there that bear record in heaven, the Father, the Word, and the Holy Ghost; and these three are one.” This Trinitarian statement is sometimes called the Johannine Comma. It is believed by modern scholars to be an interpolation, a place where, in the process of textual transmission, a phrase was added to the Biblical text. However, in that passage, even without the Johannine Comma, we see the persons of the Trinity referred to clearly: “This is He...**Jesus Christ**...and the **Spirit** is the one who testifies, because the **Spirit** is truth...If we receive the testimony of men, the testimony of **God** is greater, for this is the testimony of **God** that He has borne concerning His **Son**” (1 John 5:6-9).

Recently while studying 1 Corinthians using the Concordia Commentary on the book written by Gregory Lockwood, I learned of another Trinitarian formulation that is used in Paul's writing. A good example of it can be seen in 1 Corinthians 12:4-6. "Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same **Spirit**; and there are varieties of service, but the same **Lord**; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same **God** who empowers them all in everyone." In this passage, Paul includes each person of the Trinity (though in the reverse of our "usual" order) to express the church's unity, even in the midst of variety. A similar thing happens in Ephesians 4:4-6, where Paul includes the same kind of formulation: "There is one body and one **Spirit** – just as you were called to the one hope that belongs to your call – one **Lord**, one faith, one baptism, one **God and Father** of all."

Apparently, you can teach on old dog (pastor) new tricks (bits of Biblical knowledge)! Take this as encouragement in two directions: one, never let someone claim to you that "the Trinity is not in the Bible"; and two, keep studying God's Word!

Each week, a portion of Luther's Small Catechism has been appointed for congregational focus. You are encouraged, as you are able, to meditate on this section of the catechism throughout the week and to commit it to memory.

August 2

The Seventh Commandment You shall not steal.

What does this mean?

We should fear and love God so that we do not take our neighbor's money or possessions, or get them in any dishonest way, but help him to improve and protect his possessions and income.

August 9

Confession *What sins should we confess?*

Before God we should plead guilty of all sins, even those we are not aware of, as we do in the Lord's Prayer; but before the pastor we should confess only those sins which we know and feel in our hearts.

August 16

Holy Baptism - First *What is Baptism?*

Baptism is not just plain water, but it is the water included in God's command and combined with God's word.

August 23

Holy Baptism - First

Which is that word of God?

Christ our Lord says in the last chapter of Matthew: "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." (Matthew 28:19)

August 30

Confession

Which are these?

Consider your place in life according to the Ten Commandments: Are you a father, mother, son, daughter, husband, wife, or worker? Have you been disobedient, unfaithful, or lazy? Have you been hot-tempered, rude, or quarrelsome? Have you hurt someone by your words or deeds? Have you stolen, been negligent, wasted anything, or done any harm?

Congratulations! In the last year, you have reviewed the six chief parts of Luther's Small Catechism. Of course, we remain lifelong students of the Word of God and the Catechism. Martin Luther remarked, "For myself I say this...I act as a child who is being taught the catechism.... I must still read and study it daily. Yet I cannot master the catechism as I wish." There is enough there for all of us to ponder, to learn, to continue to learn, and in which to grow, for a lifetime.

Our Place provides after school programming for students, ages 13-20, who require supervision to ensure their safety. Activities are designed to promote academic, social, and life skills, as well as provide opportunities to grow spiritually through community service and enrichment activities. Our Place fulfills Jesus' call to compassion by being a community for and with our neighbors. This grant will fund the purchase of a special needs accessible 12-person van for the afterschool program.



Trinity Lutheran Church (TLC) Missionaries, Pastor Dan and Joan Jastram are continuing their mission efforts by serving the Lord in Japan where he serves as the Asia Lutheran Resource Coordinator. His efforts make Lutheran resources of theology and worship available in Asia in addition to the progress they are making on the current Japanese translation project of Luther's Small Catechism which is about 80% completed.

The Jastram's are currently on Home Service and will be our guests on Sunday, August 2 where Pastor Dan will be preaching and they will also be making a presentation during the Adult Bible Study Hour, followed by a Potluck meal. The Outreach Board will be providing pulled pork, prepared by Johnny Longoria, with the rest of the meal being a typical potluck.

Our individual support is vital to their continued mission work in Japan: regular worship services, translation of theological resources and nurturing relations with local Lutheran pastors facing individual challenges to their faith. The needed support is through prayer as well as financially. If you are willing and able to support them financially you can make the check payable to The Lutheran Church - Missouri Synod with "Support of Asia-Jastram" in the memo.



Several Trinity members worked on the Habitat for Humanity blitz build on Thurs, July 2nd. They helped to construct the new Pioneer Care Daycare project, Channing Child Care Village.



LERT Disaster Relief in Detroit Lakes: The Outreach board promoted the recruitment of volunteers to help with the clean up efforts following the tornado that tore through the area outside of Detroit Lakes, destroying trees and property in its path. Steve Mouritsen and Dave Schneeberger helped as members of the LERT chainsaw crew, and Leon and Lori Dawkins provided and served lunch at Zion Lutheran Church for the volunteers during one of the work days. It was an amazing experience to be able to support several of the Zion members by helping to clean up their properties. 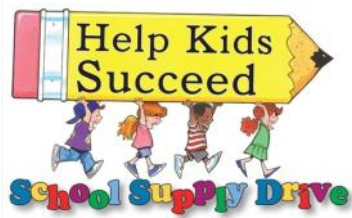
